# Instructions on How to Enter Open Class Exhibits

- 1. Fair Book: The Fair Book contains all the entry guidelines, classes and descriptions. Access the 2024 Larimer County Fair Book online at: <a href="https://www.treventscomplex.com/events/larimer-county-fair/4-h-and-open-class">https://www.treventscomplex.com/events/larimer-county-fair/4-h-and-open-class</a>. Each department is listed separately. Information follows regarding this specific department. Printed Fair Books may be requested from the Competitions Coordinator at 970-619-4023, boldtla@larimer.org
- 2. **Schedule:** Read the Open Class Schedule at the end of this document.
- 3. General Information: Read the general information and rules and follow the specific information for departments. Photography exhibitors should be sure to understand and follow the rules for size and mounting of photos before arriving at check-in.
- 4. **Exhibitors** do not need to be Larimer County residents to enter.
- 5. Online Entry: Complete the Open Class Registration online through Fair Entry (not 4-H online) <a href="http://lcfopenclass.fairentry.com">http://lcfopenclass.fairentry.com</a>
  If you are in the Fair Entry System as an exhibitor and you just need to add classes. If you are a new exhibitor, please sign up as such and follow the prompts to set you up as an exhibitor. Then add your classes. Everyone should make sure to hit the submit button and receive confirmation of your entries.
- 6. Entry: Pre-Registration Entry is recommended in all departments through an on-line Fair Entry system beginning Friday, March 1st through Tuesday, July 23rd at 11:50 pm. Written entry forms can be requested through the Competitions Coordinator at 970-619-4023, boldtla@larimer.org. Printed entries can be emailed, delivered or mailed to the Larimer County Fair Office, 5280 Arena Circle, Ste #100, Loveland, CO 80538. Entry Office opens at 8:30 a.m. and closes at 4:30 p.m. Postmarks, faxes, or email pre-registration will be accepted only if posted on or before July 23rd at 4:30 pm.
- 7. **Late Registration** Late Entries Taken at Department Check-In, Tuesday, July 30th. Horticulture late entries will be accepted on Wednesday, July 31st from 7:30 a.m. 10:00 a.m.
- 8. **Check-In** Park in the McKee Building parking lot or Lot A or B then enter on the Northeast doors in South Hall of the 1st National Bank building at The Ranch. Open Class exhibits (exception Horticulture) must be received **Tuesday, July 30<sup>th</sup> between 4:00 p.m.** and **7:00 p.m.** Horticulture exhibits check-in Wednesday, July 31st between 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. At check-in, arrive in time to receive your exhibitor identification tag(s). Review the information on the I.D. tag and assign one tag to each exhibit. Take exhibit(s) to the respective departments.
- 9. Check-Out Please return to The Ranch South Hall of the 1<sup>st</sup> National Bank building to pick up your exhibits on Wednesday, August 7 between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Collect any awards won. If you are unable to pick up your exhibits that evening, please have someone else do it for you. Removal of any exhibit before the designated time requires written approval from the Superintendent or Exhibitor Coordinator. Violation of this rule shall cause the exhibitor to forfeit any awards due to him or her.
- 10. Judging Viewing of judging is open to the public. You are welcome to listen and learn from the judges.
- 11. All products exhibited must have been prepared since August 1, 2023, except for quilts or photography. Exhibits can be entered only once.
- 12. Any article may be tested to the satisfaction of the judges. All articles and garments entered must be clean.
- 13. Children's age is determined as of December 31, 2023.
- 14. Only one entry will be accepted in each class from each exhibitor except Fine Arts, Photography, and Spinning and Weaving. No Champion or Reserve Champion will be awarded if the exhibit is not worthy.
- 15. Special awards will be chosen at the discretion of the judge(s) in each department and coordinated through the Superintendents.
- 16. All exhibits must remain on exhibit for the entire Fair, regardless of whether an award is given.
- 17. **Special Awards** Exhibitors may collect special awards for department winners. Collection of the award is as follows: Wednesday, August 7th 4:00 p.m. 7:00 p.m. Otherwise at the Ranch Administration office Thursday, August 8th, 8:30 am 4:30 p.m. and Friday, August 9th<sup>th</sup> 8:30 a.m. noon. Special awards not collected will be forfeited. No Exceptions.
- 18. Premiums/Money Premiums will be given for class placement in youth designated classes. No money is awarded for general/adult classes.
- 19. The use of marijuana or CBD in any display, food item, or exhibit is prohibited and shall be rejected.
- 20. Classes may be combined or divided at the discretion of the superintendents. If there are 3 or more items in a miscellaneous or "Any Other" class, a new class may be made.

## **Creative Crafts**

### **Key dates and times:**

Entry for Creative Crafts exhibits: Tuesday, August 1, 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Judging time for Creative Crafts exhibits: Wednesday, Aug 2, 7:00 a.m. Check-out for Creative Crafts exhibits: Wednesday, August 9, 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Viewing of judged and awarded items is open to the public Friday, August 4, beginning at 4:00 p.m.
- 2. All exhibits must have been completed since August 1, 2023.
- 3. Children, Youth and Teen exhibitors will need to supply their date of birth upon entry.
- 4. All items will be judged on workmanship, beauty of design, general appearance, creativity, and how it will be used.
- 5. An exhibitor may enter only one item in each class.
- 6. Classes may be combined and/or divided at the discretion of the superintendent and judge.
- 7. Classes 110 300 should be made by a child with minimum supervision by an adult. Please indicate age at Fair Entry.
- 8. Items meant to be hung will be hung, unless otherwise requested by the exhibitor.
- 9. If a class doesn't exist anywhere in the **OTHER** Open Class departments for an exhibit, it may be shown in the Open Class Creative Crafts class #500.
- 10. If your exhibit is overly large (i.e. wagon, saddle, doll house, furniture or other large object) please include dimensions and alert staff on entry form when entering so ample space can be planned for display.
- 11. Payment of Awards: Exhibitors may collect special awards. See Open Class Division General Rules and Regulations for schedule. Special awards not collected before noon August 11, will be forfeited. No Exceptions.

### Children - 12 years and under

### Class

- 110. Children, 4 and under, any craft
- 120. Children 5 & 6 years of age, any craft
- 130. Handcrafted item of leather or wood,
- **140.** Item of paper, clay, stone, or any other medium not listed in class #130
- 150. Jewelry, all materials
- 160. Original creation made with Legos, MUST BE MOUNTED TO A SOLID BASE
- 170. Any item made from a kit
- 180. Children 7 years and older, any craft not above

### Teens – 13 years through 18

### Class

- 200. Handcrafted item of metal, leather, or wood
- 210. Item of paper, clay, stone, or any other item not listed in class #200
- 220. Jewelry, all materials
- 230. Original creation made with Legos, MUST BE MOUNTED TO A SOLID BASE
- 240. Any item made from a kit
- 250. Robotics, small engine items

### All Ages

### Class

- **300.** Item made from recycled materials (enter recycled garment or sewn item in Machine Work Department)
- 310. Painting on any type of material cloth, wood, etc. except paper
- 320. Memory Books / Scrapbooking, a single page entry
- 330. Any Holiday Craft
- 340. Floral Arranging, Silk & Dried Arrangements
- 350. Wreaths, all designs, and shapes
- 360. Basket, handmade, any material
- **370.** Jewelry, hand crafted original designs
- 380. Jewelry, beads, wire, any other material designs
- 390. Beadwork, all designs, and items
- 400. Leathercraft, all styles, and designs
- 410. Stained Glass
- **420.** Item made with <u>natural stones</u>, painted or with other added materials.
- **430.** Woodcarving, people, including caricatures
- 440. Woodcarving, critters
- 450. Carving, all other materials and designs, bark, gourds, ornaments, i.e. pinewood derby car
- **460.** Woodworking item using techniques other than carving
- 470. Functional item made with any material, furniture, home décor
- 480. Any item made from a kit
- 490. Robotics, small engine items
- 500. Any craft/material NOT listed in any other class
- **510.** Any craft item made by individual 60 to 70 years old
- **520.** Any craft item made by individual over 71 years old
