Instructions on How to Enter Open Class Exhibits

- 1. Fair Book: The Fair Book contains all the entry guidelines, classes and descriptions. Access the 2024 Larimer County Fair Book online at: https://www.treventscomplex.com/events/larimer-county-fair/4-h-and-open-class. Each department is listed separately. Information follows regarding this specific department. Printed Fair Books may be requested from the Competitions Coordinator at 970-619-4023, boldtla@larimer.org
- 2. **Schedule:** Read the Open Class Schedule at the end of this document.
- 3. General Information: Read the general information and rules and follow the specific information for departments.
- 4. Exhibitors do not need to be Larimer County residents to enter.
- 5. Online Entry: Complete the Open Class Registration online through Fair Entry (not 4-H online) http://lcfopenclass.fairentry.com
 If you are in the Fair Entry System as an exhibitor and you just need to add classes. If you are a new exhibitor, please sign up as such and follow the prompts to set you up as an exhibitor. Then add your classes. Everyone should make sure to hit the submit button and receive confirmation of your entries.
- 6. Entry: Pre-Registration Entry is recommended in all departments through an on-line Fair Entry system beginning Friday, March 1st through Tuesday, July 23rd at 11:50 pm. Written entry forms can be requested through the Competitions Coordinator at 970-619-4023, boldtla@larimer.org. Printed entries can be emailed, delivered or mailed to the Larimer County Fair Office, 5280 Arena Circle, Ste #100, Loveland, CO 80538. Entry Office opens at 8:30 a.m. and closes at 4:30 p.m. Postmarks, faxes, or email pre-registration will be accepted only if posted on or before July 23rd at 4:30 pm.
- 7. **Late Registration** Late Entries Taken at Department Check-In, Tuesday, July 30th. Horticulture late entries will be accepted on Wednesday, July 31st from 7:30 a.m. 10:00 a.m.
- 8. Check-In Park in the McKee Building parking lot or Lot A or B then enter on the Northeast doors in South Hall of the 1st National Bank building at The Ranch. Open Class exhibits (exception Horticulture) must be received **Tuesday**, **July 30**th **between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.** Horticulture exhibits check-in Wednesday, July 31st between 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. At check-in, arrive in time to receive your exhibitor identification tag(s). Review the information on the I.D. tag and assign one tag to each exhibit. Take exhibit(s) to the respective departments.
- 9. Check-Out Please return to The Ranch South Hall of the 1st National Bank building to pick up your exhibits on Wednesday, August 7 between 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. Collect any awards won. If you are unable to pick up your exhibits that evening, please have someone else do it for you. Removal of any exhibit before the designated time requires written approval from the Superintendent or Exhibitor Coordinator. Violation of this rule shall cause the exhibitor to forfeit any awards due him or her.
- 10. Judging Viewing of judging is open to the public. You are welcome to listen and learn from the judges.
- 11. All products exhibited must have been prepared since August 1, 2023, except for quilts. Exhibits can be entered only once.
- 12. Any article may be tested to the satisfaction of the judges. All articles and garments entered must be clean.
- 13. Children's age is determined as of December 31, 2023.
- 14. Only one entry will be accepted in each class from each exhibitor except Fine Arts, Photography, and Spinning and Weaving. No Champion or Reserve Champion will be awarded if the exhibit is not worthy.
- 15. Special awards will be chosen at the discretion of the judge(s) in each department and coordinated through the Superintendents.
- 16. All exhibits must remain on exhibit for the entire Fair, regardless of whether an award is given.
- 17. **Special Awards** Exhibitors may collect special awards for department winners. Collection of the award is as follows: Wednesday, August 7th 4:00 p.m. 7:00 p.m. Otherwise at the Ranch Administration office Thursday, August 8th, 8:30 am 4:30 p.m. and Friday, August 9thth 8:30 a.m. noon. Special awards not collected will be forfeited. No Exceptions.
- 18. Premiums/Money Premiums will be given for class placement in youth designated classes. No money is awarded for general/adult classes.
- 19. The use of marijuana or CBD in any display, food item, or exhibit is prohibited and shall be rejected.
- 20. Classes may be combined or divided at the discretion of the superintendents. If there are 3 or more items in a miscellaneous or "Any Other" class, a new class may be made.

Quilting

Key dates and times:

Entry for Quilting exhibits: Tuesday, July 30th, 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. Judging time Quilting exhibits: Wednesday, July 31st, 9:00 a.m.

Check-out for Quilting exhibits: Wednesday, August 7th, 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

- 1. Viewing of judging is open to the public Wednesday, July 30th, beginning at 9:00 a.m. No discussion between exhibitors and judges will be allowed during the judging process.
- 2. All articles entered in this department can be entered in the Larimer County Fair only once.
- 3. All articles entered must be clean and free of animal hair and odors including smoke.
- 4. Only one entry will be accepted in each class per exhibitor. In some cases, the class will be determined by the perimeter of the quilt. (The distance around the outside edges of the quilt.)
- 5. All work must be done by the exhibitor. An exception is the Duet Category, where quilting is done by another.
- 6. All name tags and labels need to be covered or removed.
- 7. Articles will be judged on workmanship, design, and suitability to purpose.
- 8. Ages for the youth division will be their age on December 31, 2023.
- 9. If you require special hanging brackets or handling, we will try to accommodate your needs. However, if the superintendents do not feel the quilt can be handled or hung safely it will not be accepted.
- 10. Once a quilt is entered in a class it can only be moved to a different class if it was entered in an incorrect class and must be approved by the superintendents.
- 11. If the exhibitor or volunteer is unclear of the correct class for a quilt, they will request assistance from the superintendents for determination.
- 12. Payment of Awards: Exhibitors may collect special awards. See Open Class Division General Rules and Regulations for schedule. Special awards not collected before noon Friday, August 9, will be forfeited. No Exceptions.
- 13. Champion & Reserve Champion Rosette Ribbons will be awarded per judge discretion after judging is completed for a class grouping.

Definitions:

- 1. Art Quilt is a contemporary artwork of original design involving the creative expression of carious processes, such as dying, painting, stitching, embellishing, quilting and weaving. An Art Quilt does not follow traditional block lines, borders or binding. These reflect imagery or ideas and are not made from a pattern, kit or class instructions. They will be judged on creativity, workmanship and suitability of intent. Let your creativity go wild!
- 2. Duet is a quilt made by one person and quilted by another.
- 3. Free motion quilting is hand guided, either on a home machine or long-arm.

Adult Division

One person quilts. Made by one person only. Should be entered in Classes 100 – 220.

Made by one person and quilted by someone else. Should be entered in classes 230 to 290.

Note: For the following classes, quilting may or may not be done by the exhibitor.

Special Techniques

Quilt must be completed recently. Each technique will be judged separately. Hand embroidery and hand applique should be represented in the majority of the quilt.

- 410. Hand pieced and machine quilted
- 420. Machine pieced and hand quilted
- 430. Hand embroidered blocks (making up the majority of the quilt top)
- 440. Hand applique (used in the majority of the quilt top)
- 450. Whole cloth (top layer is made from a single piece of fabric.

No applique or patchwork is used in the design. The appearance relies on the quilting motifs chosen and quilting stitches are usually intricate and closely spaced.)

Christmas Quilt

Quilt follows a Christmas theme with machine piecing and quilting. Applique, embroidery (hand or machine), embellishments may be added.

Applique, embroidery (hand or machine), embellishments may be added.

Antique (old) quilts that are in excellent condition. Please write a brief history/story. These <u>do not compete with Restored Quilts</u>. The purpose is to showcase the importance of quilts in our family and country history. Will be awarded a ribbon only.

Not eligible for Champion/Reserve Champion or special award consideration.

Art Quilts LETTING YOUR CREATIVITY RUN WILD!

An art quilt is a contemporary artwork of original design involving the creative expression and exploration of various processes, such as dyeing, painting, stitching, embellishing, quilting, and weaving. An art quilt does not follow traditional block lines. These reflect imagery or ideas and are NOT made from a pattern, kit or class instructions.

800. Pictorial (example: scenic nature scene portrayed with cloth and thread) any size

810. Abstract (collage, using fabric to "paint" a representation) any size

Multi-person Quilts by group

These classes are for quilts where 3 or more people are involved in making the quilt. One or more persons may make the top and one person or a group of people may do the quilting.

Requirement: Attach a 3" x 5" card with the entry tag, listing the group name and the contact person. Ribbon will be awarded to the group.

900. Group quilt, Perimeter 300" or less 910. Group quilt, Perimeter 301" or greater

Accessories

Must be 3 layers quilted. May be either hand or machine quilted. Hand or machine appliques, embroidery and embellishments may be added.

1000. Wall hanging, no side longer than 60". Must be 3 layers quilted. Must have a hanging sleeve

1100. Table runners and placemats. Must be 3 layers quilted.

1200. Pillows. Top must be 3 layers quilted.

1300. Purses, totes, and bags. Must be 3 layers quilted.
